in Scotland, to continually championing the places and people that make up our unique and world-renowned built environment. Our focus has always been, and remains, policy and strategy for the sector. Looking to the horizon, and ensuring we know where the sector needs to steer - taking advantage of fair winds, and collectively bracing for the storms.

In 2018 BEFS policy role became full-time - significantly increasing our activity and output for the sector. This capacity has enabled BEFS to work with the sector -

Social movements have brought new perspectives to the fore. Covid changed our understanding of place interactions. Thinking around the climate has coalesced into national and supra national asks and terms. The economy and how and where we spend money has changed - from online expansion, to cost of living crises. Our work now encompasses far more than the bricks and mortar (or lime and sandstone) our originators may have imagined, but BEFS continues to support Members, Associates, and the wider sector. Informing, debating and advocating for the role our existing environment can, and does play in a sustainable future.


